

COD AU GRATIN RECIPE

- 1 pound cod fillets, cut into cubes
- ¹/₄ cup butter
- 1/4 cup flour, all-purpose
- 1 ¼ cup milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1 small onion, finely chopped (optional)
- 1/2 cup breadcrumbs or cracker crumbs
- 1/2 cup cheddar cheese, grated



- 1. Preheat oven to 375 °F. Place cod in greased baking dish or individual baking dishes.
- 2. In saucepan, melt butter; stir in flour until smooth and remove from heat.
- 3. Gradually stir in half (1/2) the milk; return to heat and beat until smooth and shiny. Gradually add remaining milk, salt, pepper and onion. Cook, stirring, until smooth and thickened.
- 4. Pour sauce over fish and sprinkle with breadcrumbs and cheese.
- 5. Bake in 375 °F oven for 20 to 30 minutes until sauce bubbles and fish is cooked. Serves 4

THE WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON KNITTING CLUB






