A NEWS AND VIEWS STORY

Like many of us, I look forward to getting my copy of NEWS AND VIEWS, our monthly newsletter. It has kept me informed and entertained for over 20 years. It provides information of upcoming activities, included humorous articles and jokes and, of course, some advertising from local businesses, vying for my interest in their services. I would miss it if it were gone and I would like to take this opportunity to recognize one of the many volunteers who helped establish, grow and modernize this publication over its 25+ year run.

Ron Hardy, whom I had the privilege to meet last week, was integral in establishing a base of advertisers, thereby securing the longevity of our small and vital publication. He volunteered his time, his energy and his personality to this cause, He made the contacts, wooed the business owners, secured those payments and he gave this publication the stability it needed to grow. Consider that, when Ron first became involved, NEWS AND VIEWS was not the publication we recognize today. Originally the paper was produced by a team of volunteers who typed articles, then cut and pasted these together, along with pictures, on a master copy. That document would then be photocopied and stabled together by hand, over 100 times to meet distribution demands. Imagine the amount of work this required. As the Club grew, it became more and more challenging to produce enough papers this way to fill the requirement.

It was about this time that Ron joined the Club and he suggested getting the papers printed at a local print shop. It was a great idea but would cost money. So, Ron started going door to door to local Markham businesses and was successful in securing the advertising investment needed to keep the paper going. With continued membership growth, by 2019, approximately 500 copies were printed each month. On top of this, as many of the members now had access to computers, the Club was able to put each edition on line for those who preferred it. Advertising in our newsletter is an important part of the success of our publication. I have taken over Ron's duties in providing information to interested advertisers and issuing invoices and collecting payment (all without leaving my chair). Ever since joining the NEWS AND VIEWS team, I had heard about the efforts put forth by this legend Ron Hardy, but had no idea that we would meet some day. A few weeks ago, a couple, Dave and Collette arrived at the front desk of our Club asking if they could have a copy of the current newsletter for Dave's father. As the hard copies can only be distributed to members, I asked if their father qualified as a member and they gave me his name, Ron Hardy. I gave them the copy they asked for in exchange for an invitation to speak with Ron in person. He lives in a nearby apartment and is celebrating his 99th birthday this month. He is a delightful gentleman and we spent two hours together chatting.

the wait list.






