#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT ... Mark Barrett

I want to thank all the candidates for election in May along with the nomination committee Mary Lou Busato, Gloria Smith & Ken Buderick. A full election report can be found on page 3.

The City of Markham advises they will be moving to a new Registration and Membership Management system in September 2023. This will require changes to the Membership registration process. The key change will be that an email address will now be required to create an account. For anyone that does not currently have an active email address, you have the option of using an email address belonging to a family member or a friend. Please note however, that the new system will not allow more than one account to be created using the same email. The new Registration/Membership system requires that all members create accounts with the City of Markham, and it is mandatory for each account to be set up using an email address. This email address is not intended to be used for communication purposes, but instead will act as part of your log-in credentials for your City of Markham account.

Should any customers not have or are unwilling to provide their email address, a default email address can be used to create that individual's account. However, this can only be done by City of Markham staff and would not allow the customer to create and/or log into their new account online themselves. Any members who choose to create an account without an email will not have access to some features of the registration system including online program registration, online bookings, and will not receive communication regarding City of Markham programs. Without an email address, they will not be provided with log-in credentials so their account can only be managed in-person by City of Markham staff.

City of Markham staff are working on instructions to create a new City of Markham account, as well as a new email address (if needed). They will be at the club later in June to answer questions and to help anyone that needs further assistance with setting up an email address and/or a City of Markham account. Specific dates and times will be posted on the bulletin boards, website, and lobby monitor.
