News from the Watercolor and Acrylics Painting Classes

OAIA members from all walks of life and diversity would gather in the west activity room weekly with a common interest in the passion for art painting. Some are beginners while others are masters from many years in the art. No one feels intimidated regardless of experience. We treat and support each other with respect and even lend supplies to one another to those who forget to bring or don't have during class. Many friendships have developed in these fun classes over the years.

We are fortunate to have an excellent teacher in "Hurricane" Fiona Evans who provides the lessons for the two watercolor classes on Tuesday mornings and afternoons. She also conducts our acrylics painting classes on Wednesday mornings. These classes are so popular and in high demand. Usually there's a wait list for other OAIA members wanting to participate.

Watercolor painting is trickier than acrylics painting. The former is an exercise of patience as we wait for the paint to dry or not to dry before applying the next layer of paint to accomplish the end result. With experience comes satisfaction. Acrylics painting is more forgiving as we cover layers of paint to exaggerate our vision and style or to cover up mistakes.

Every session starts off with a review and critique of the previous class assignment. Helpful suggestions are provided by our art teacher for each participant's submission as well as a flood of compliments and encouragements. New lessons begin with a finished painting posted by Fiona. A demonstration of specific techniques, information on paint color choices, brush sizes and types, and additional tools are given in the step-by-step instructions. No one is left stranded to achieve their final piece. Assistance and guidance are available while our instructor goes around the tables giving individual attentions.

Before our summer break, for many years we held potluck luncheons at Paula Cashen's lovely home up north. This past spring, Paula did all the work organizing a luncheon for us at Boston Pizza. We are like a big family!

Our artists will soon be showcasing some of our paintings in the coffee lounge. Please feel free to look at them. They are there for your viewing pleasure.

If you are interested in participating in one of the Tuesday watercolor classes, please contact the Front Desk to find out how to have your name added to the waiting list. Currently the Wednesday morning acrylics class is full. However, if there are ever enough willing seniors who want to start another class, we could commence a class for Wednesday afternoons. This is only a possibility for now depending on how many people sign up on the waiting list at the front desk.
